COMPLAINT

NOW COMES Plaintiff, BETTER GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION, by its undersigned attorneys, LOEVY & LOEVY, and brings this Freedom of Information Act suit to require Defendant METROPOLITAN WATER RECLAMATION DISTRCT to produce an audio recording of a MWRD officer reportedly using racial slurs and describing on an open police radio channel a secret "hang out" room in which MWRD officers watch television and drink on the job and otherwise engage in improper conduct at taxpayer expense. In support of its Complaint, BETTER GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION alleges:

INTRODUCTION

1. Pursuant to the fundamental philosophy of the American constitutional form of government, it is the public policy of the State of Illinois that all persons are entitled to full and complete information regarding the affairs of government and the official acts and policies of those who represent them as public officials and public employees consistent with the terms of the Illinois Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"). 5 ILCS 140/1.

- 2. Restraints on access to information, to the extent permitted by FOIA, are limited exceptions to the principle that the people of this state have a right to full disclosure of information relating to the decisions, policies, procedures, rules, standards, and other aspects of government activity that affect the conduct of government and the lives of the people. *Id*.
- 3. All public records of a public body are presumed to be open to inspection or copying. Any public body that asserts that a record is exempt from disclosure has the burden of proving by clear and convincing evidence that it is exempt. 5 ILCS 140/1.2.
- 4. Under FOIA Section 11(h), "except as to causes the court considers to be of greater importance, proceedings arising under [FOIA] shall take precedence on the docket over all other causes and be assigned for hearing and trial at the earliest practicable date and expedited in every way."
- 5. Defendant MWRD has violated FOIA by refusing to produce the audio recording of a MWRD officer reportedly using racial slurs and describing on an open police radio channel a secret "hang out" room in which MWRD officers watch television and drink on the job and otherwise engage in improper conduct at taxpayer expense.

PARTIES

- 6. Plaintiff BETTER GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION ("BGA") is a nonpartisan, Illinois non-profit corporation, whose mission is to educate the public about waste, inefficiencies, and corruption in government by acting as a watchdog agency uncovering and exposing this type of activity; to promote respect for the law; and to support public officials in the rightful performance of their duties. BGA was founded in 1923 to protect the integrity of the political process in Chicago.
 - 7. Defendant MWRD is a public body located in Cook County, Illinois.

BGA'S FOIA REQUEST AND MWRD'S DENIAL

- 8. On February 6, 2015, BGA requested from MWRD "any and all recordings and audio relating to the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District officer who was recorded and was the subject of last night's FOX 32 report. To be clear, I am told that on either Jan. 24 or Jan. 25, 2015, the Illinois State Police recorded a conversation on a police radio band shared with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago. The conversation involved a MWRD officer at the Stickney Treatment Facility speaking for several minutes while his radio was unknowingly keyed. The conversation was overheard by ISP officials, who then brought it to the attention of MWRD officials because of the nature of the comments made by the officer. ISP has turned over a copy of that recording to the MWRD." A true and correct copy of the request is attached as Exhibit A.
- 9. A true and correct copy of FOX 32's story about the incident is available at http://www.myfoxchicago.com/story/28039159/secret-drinking-room.
- 10. MWRD's executive director has stated that the officer used words that were "very inappropriate on many levels" and "very disturbing."
- 11. On February 11, 2015, MWRD denied the request, claiming that the recording is exempt under FOIA Section 7(1)(n) as a record "relating to a public body's adjudication of employee grievances or disciplinary cases." A true and correct copy of the denial is attached as Exhibit B.
- 12. The requested audio was not created in the course of any adjudication of any employee grievances or disciplinary cases.
 - 13. The requested audio was created in the ordinary course of business.
 - 14. The requested audio was created before MWRD learned of its existence.

- 15. The requested audio would exist regardless of whether any employee grievance or disciplinary case was brought or the outcome of that process.
- 16. Drinking on the job by law enforcement officers at a water treatment plant would be a serious public safety problem and violate MWRD rules and regulations.
- 17. Use of racial slurs by law enforcement officers would call into question whether those officers are complying with the U.S. and State Constitution in performing their duties.
- 18. The requested audio recording includes statements about the use of property paid for using public funds.
- 19. The requested audio recording includes statements about activities public employees have been engaged in while being paid using public funds.
- 20. Under FOIA Section 1, the public has a duty to monitor government to ensure that it is being conducted in the public interest. That duty cannot be fulfilled here without access to the requested audio, and requiring the public simply to trust that MWRD will properly and transparently respond to this issue would make it impossible for the public to perform this statutory duty critical to the democratic process.

COUNT I – VIOLATION OF FOIA

- 21. The above paragraphs are incorporated by reference.
- 22. MWRD is a public body under FOIA.
- 23. The requested records exist and are not exempt under FOIA.
- 24. MWRD has willfully and intentionally violated FOIA by failing to produce the records requested by BGA.

WHEREFORE, BGA asks that the Court:

- in accordance with FOIA Section 11(f), afford this case precedence on the Court's
 docket except as to causes the Court considers to be of greater importance, assign
 this case for hearing and trial at the earliest practicable date, and expedite this
 case in every way;
- ii. declare that MWRD has violated FOIA;
- iii. order MWRD to produce the requested audio record under FOIA;
- iv. enjoin MWRD from withholding non-exempt public records under FOIA;
- v. award BGA reasonable attorneys' fees and costs;
- vi. order MWRD to pay civil penalties for willfully and intentionally violating FOIA in bad faith; and
- vii. award such other relief the Court considers appropriate.
